***GRID-Arendal and the Global Environmental Agenda:
the next 30 years***

GRID-Arendal has influenced the global debate for key environmental issues of our time. Over 30 years GRID-Arendal has worked with UN Environment and Norwegian government ministries and many others to produce cutting-edge reports, maps and graphics that transform the world's policies and perceptions of the environment. GRID-Arendal's work has had an extraordinary scope, bringing to light issues such as: the environmental crime crisis, climate change impacts on small island developing states, Arctic environment and capacity building in northern communities, assisting developing countries to submit seabed territory claims under the UN Law of the Sea, coral bleaching, "blue carbon" in the global carbon cycle, transboundary issues in African rivers, and most recently marine litter, waste and circular economy solutions. Being close to, but not limited by UN structures when supporting UN Environment allows GRID-Arendal to be both nimble and impactful, addressing complex emerging environmental issues by conveying the highest quality scientific information to decision makers.

A major, tangible outcome of this work has been the adoption of resolutions by the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA), urging nations to take action to avoid and curb harm to the environment. In many cases, UNEA resolutions have GRID-Arendal as a vital part of their DNA, as they are constructed from work completed through the UN Environment and GRID-Arendal partnership. The government of Norway plays a crucial role by supporting the partnership between UN Environment and GRID-Arendal not only financially but also sponsoring UNEA resolutions and side events at UNEA that bring the resulting information to impact. Partly in recognition of this demonstrated leadership, Norway's Minister for Climate and the Environment, Ola Elvestuen, has been elected as President of UNEA-5 in 2021. In summary, the tripartite partnership of UN Environment, the government of Norway and GRID-Arendal has led to tremendous impact for the global environment.

What then, does the future hold? Delegates at UNEA-4 acknowledged mounting evidence that the Earth is increasingly polluted, rapidly warming and dangerously depleted. We are making insufficient progress in advancing the SDGs. Bold, urgent actions, and laws are needed to bring teeth to UNEA resolutions. Creative, innovative, and exciting initiatives must inspire changes in consumption and production, and engage businesses, individuals, groups, communities, and nations to a meaningful commitment for change. GRID-Arendal is proud to bring together creative, diverse, and experienced experts, policy makers, and community builders to communicate in ways that inspires and speeds change.
